Title: Solutions for SLPs: Aligning Our Work with Research and Regulations

Abstract: In this two-part seminar, SLPs must understand the many requirements for evaluation and eligibility for SLPs services that federal and state law set forth for U.S. schools. Comprehensive evaluation and documentation of all required eligibility criteria can help school SLPs combat overidentification, high SLP caseloads, and civil rights concerns. This session will integrate federal and state regulations with best practice and the latest research in the field. Case studies will highlight the need for professionals to differentiate educational and medical regulations and requirements and provide opportunities to discuss communication with families and others.

She received a national editor's award in 2013 and international award in 2021 for articles on evidence-based practice in the schools.
