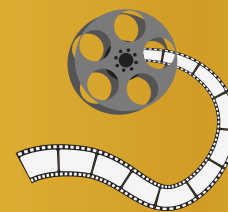

He also served as Director of the Neuroprocesses Research Laboratory and was awarded Professor Emeritus status. Dr. Molt earned dual master's degrees in audiology and speech-language pathology from the University of South Florida and a PhD in speech and hearing science from the University of Tennessee. He is dually certified, was among the first ASHA Board Certified Fluency Specialists, and is an ASHA Fellow.

Dr. Molt has held numerous leadership roles, including President of the International Fluency Association and the Speech and Hearing Association of Alabama, and Coordinator of ASHA Special Interest Group 4: Fluency and Fluency Disorders. He currently chairs the Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology Interstate Compact Commission and the Alabama Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology, and represents ASHA on the WHO Rehabilitation Competency Framework Working Group. A person who stutters, he was named National Stuttering Association's "Speech-Language Pathologist of the Year" in 2003 and continues clinical practice while serving as ASHA's Vice President for Finance.

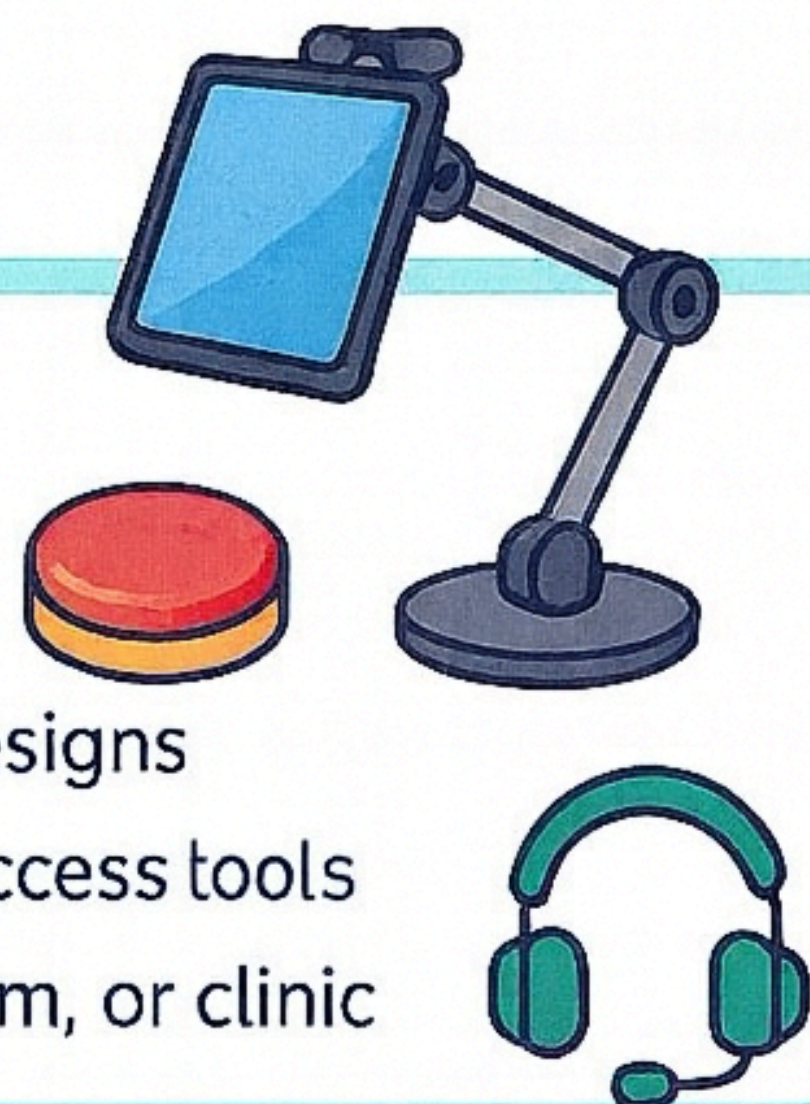

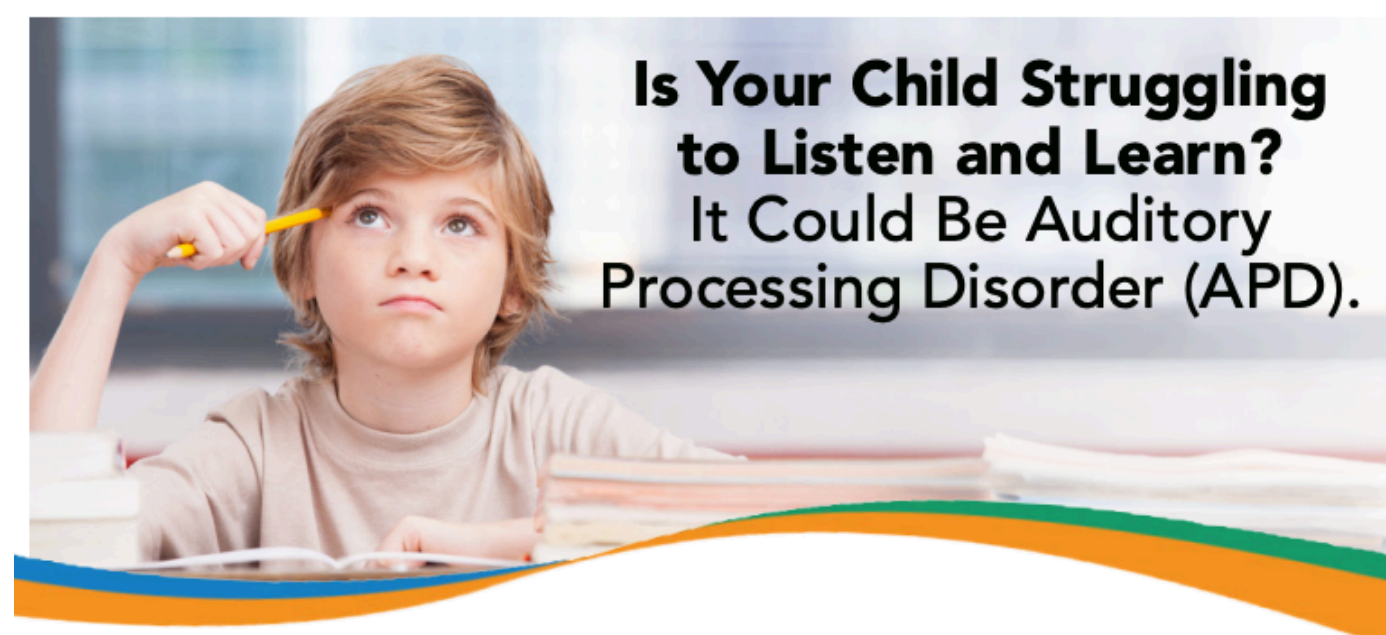

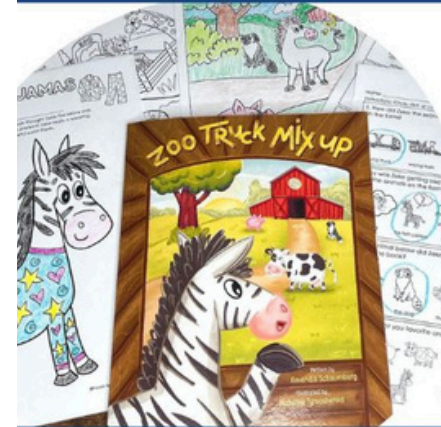

#### KEY SERVICES FOR SLPs AND THEIR CLIENTS

- **Early Intervention (Birth-3):** Natural environment therapy & family coaching through MS First Steps with SLPs, OTs, PTs, and educators.
- **AAC & Assistive Technology:** Comprehensive evaluations & training for speech-generating devices, iPad apps, eye gaze systems, and adaptive access tools. All vendor-neutral and customized for each client.
- **Pediatric Feeding Disorders Clinic:** Mississippi's only outpatient behavioral program focused on complex feeding issues – g-tube transition, failure to thrive, restricted eating, and behavior-based feeding concerns. Includes a food allergy-controlled kitchen and family coaching.
- **Autism Services & Social Skills Groups:** Evaluation and therapy for children with ASD and related disorders. Services include behavioral therapy, communication support, and structured group sessions targeting social and pragmatic language skills.
- **Psych & ABA Services:** Collaborative support for co-occurring speech/behavioral concerns: functional communication training, parent coaching, and ABA strategies in natural environments & full psychological evaluations.
- **College & Community Inclusion:** ACCESS (a post-secondary transition program), Autism Liaison Program (for degree-seeking students), and U-Thrive (for young adults with IDD focused on independent living and communication skills).

FEDERAL LAW PROHIBITS ANYONE BUT REGISTERED USERS WITH HEARING LOSS FROM USING INTERNET PROTOCOL (IP) CAPTIONED TELEPHONES WITH THE CAPTIONS TURNED ON. IP captioned telephone service may use a live operator. The operator generates captions of what the other party to the call says. These captions are then sent to your phone. There is a cost for each minute of captions generated, paid from a federally administered fund. No costs are passed along to individuals who qualify for the service. The CaptionCall phone and CaptionCall Mobile app remain the property of Sorenson in order to provide ongoing support, service, and upgrades.
